Those five joined over 600 kids from throughout the west who were afforded this opportunity by sponsors and by local Rotary Clubs. President Rand Tanner of the Rotary Club of Sparks Centennial Sunrise provided each child with \$100 spending money as they climbed on the plane. The first ever "Breakfast with Santa" event drew over 300 attendees who not only enjoyed breakfast (and a visit with Santa for the kids) but also enjoyed crafts and other activities provided by Rotarians and other volunteers.
