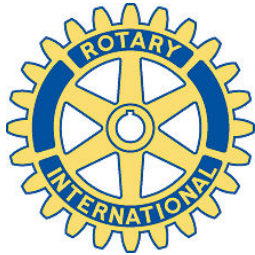

Rotary Organizes

1912-23 When clubs were formed in Canada and Great Britain in 1912, the name was changed to the International Association of Rotary Clubs, and was later shortened to Rotary International in 1922. Paul Harris was the first president of the National Association of Rotary Clubs, serving **two** terms. He was named President Emeritus of the International Association in 1912 and served until his death in 1947. Harris suffered a near fatal heart attack in his final year as president of the National Association and required a full year to recover. Yet over the next 35 years, he and his wife Jean Thomson Harris made numerous exhausting trips to nearly every continent, visiting hundreds of cities, **planting friendship trees** and attending Rotary conferences. When Rotary International President Emeritus, world traveler, author and prominent Chicago attorney Paul Harris passed away on January 27, 1947, his dream had grown from one group of four to 6,000 clubs in 75 countries with 300,000 members brought together through the service and fellowship of Rotary. Silvester Schiele was the first Rotary president. The meeting, where a president was chosen, happened to be in Schiele's office, hence, as a courtesy, he became the president.
