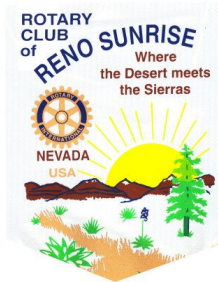
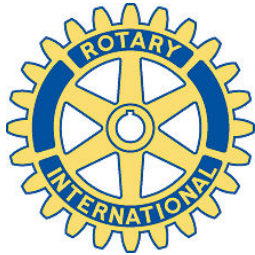

This Week's Program

Arnel Ramilo, Regional Gang Unit Washoe County

Detective Arnel Ramilo was born and raised on the Philippine Island of Sibuyan, Romblon. Detective Ramilo has been an officer with the Washoe County School District Police Department since 1995, and has been a Detective since 2001 and is currently assigned to the Regional Gang Unit. Detective Ramilo is now extensively involved with the Gang Resistance Intervention Program (GRIP), and has been promoting this program through presentations to students, parents, school staff/administrators, communities, local law enforcement agencies and social services agencies. He has conducted presentations for the Washoe County School District's Community Summit on dealing with and handling gangs in schools, and has been a speaker for the "Major Gang Task Force" conference held in Reno, Nevada. Detective Ramilo is currently one of the instructors on gangs and gang awareness for all Washoe County School District employees. Detective Ramilo continues to assist and educate students in resisting the gang lifestyle, as well as assisting school staff in preventing gang violence through gang awareness training. Detective Ramilo is committed to reducing youth gang membership and gang violence through partnerships with parents, communities, organizations, local law enforcement agencies and social services agencies.

On a personal level, Detective Ramilo has direct experience with the pressure to join a gang. While attending college in the Philippines, Detective Ramilo resisted peer pressure from friends and classmates to join the local "Gang" operating within the university system. Detective Ramilo saw first hand the effects of gang lifestyle within the university, public schools, substance abuse and threats of violence with the school and the surrounding neighborhood/businesses.
